CODES OF BEHAVIOUR

Applies to State Team Members, Coaches, Managers/Chaperones

Applies to State Team Members, Coaches and Managers/Chaperones.

Members should be aware of the Aims and Objectives of Pony Club in Australia, these are:

- to encourage young people to ride and learn to enjoy all approved kinds of sport connected with horses and riding;
- to provide instruction in riding and horsemanship and to instill in members the proper care of their animals; and
- to promote the highest ideals of fellowship, citizenship and loyalty, and to cultivate strength of character and self-discipline.

Members should also be aware that:

- pony club is a youth movement and has always maintained a high standard of behaviour and presentation;
- when representing Pony Club in any shape or form, their behaviour must never compromise, bring into disrepute or embarrass Pony Club WA
- they are ambassadors of the Pony Club WA and their actions will reflect upon everyone, including members or teams representing the Pony Club WA in future National events; and
- they should be proud of their involvement in the Pony Club movement and in their Pony Club WA State uniform.

CODES OF CONDUCT & OTHER POLICIES

Riders come under the supervision of the Coach, Manager and or Chaperone from the time they leave their home state until they return (if travelling as a team) or during the hours of competition if travelling as individuals. During this time riders are always expected to behave appropriately and to obey instructions and or directions given by either the Coach, Manager or Chaperone.

Pony Club Western Australia promotes the following codes of conduct to all people involved in any way with the sport of pony club. These codes of conduct highlight the principles and values of Pony Club WA and our related policies.

Failure by a rider to comply with the Pony Club WA Codes of Conduct and other policies may result in him/her being dismissed from the team and required to return home immediately.

Parents, Guardians or Riders aged 18 yrs and over, will be responsible for any additional costs incurred should a rider be required to return home prior to the scheduled departure date.

A high standard of behaviour is essential and specifically includes:

- 1. compliance with Pony Club WA policies; the Member Protection Policy, Alcohol & Drugs Policy, Anti-Doping Policy, Gambling & Anti Match Fixing Policy, Social Media Policy and Health Policy;
- 2. no use or possession of recreational or illicit drugs;
- 3. no sexual liaisons, physical aggression or assault;

- 4. no theft or vandalising of facilities or property;
- 5. no leaving a billet or group without permission;
- 6. no cruel actions or abuse of horses;
- 7. the official uniform is to be worn when representing Pony Club WA and at all times as directed by the Coach Manager or Chaperone;
- 8. No rider is to be a passenger in a vehicle driven by a person under 18 years of age.

General Code of Conduct

As a person involved in any way with the sport of pony club, the following standards of behaviour are expected.

Fairness

- Operate within the rules and spirit of your sport, promoting fair play over winning at any cost.
- Encourage opportunities for participants to learn appropriate behaviours and skills.
- Encourage participation in all aspects of the sport.
- Be fair, considerate and honest in all dealing with others.

Respect

- Treat each person as an individual.
- Be a positive role model.
- Display control, tolerance and courtesy to all involved with the sport.
- Value the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

Safety

- Ensure your actions contribute to a safe environment.
- Ensure your actions contribute to a harassment free environment.
- Do not tolerate violence or abusive behaviours.
- Show concern and caution towards others who may be sick or injured.

Responsibility

- Be aware of Pony Club WA's standards, rules and policies including, but not limited to, the Member Protection Policy.
- Ensure interaction with persons under the age of 18 years is appropriate and that unaccompanied and unobserved activities are avoided wherever practical.
- Always make responsible choices and adopt appropriate behaviours with respect to alcohol and recreational, illicit and performance enhancing drugs.
- Act with integrity and accept responsibility for your actions.
- Make a commitment to providing quality service.
- Understand your responsibility if you breach, or are aware of any breaches of these Codes of Conduct and other Pony Club WA rules, regulations and policies.
- Be a positive role model.

Rider

Abide by the General Code of Conduct.

- Ride by the rules.
- Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your Team Manager approach the Official during a break or after the competition.



 Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials, sledging other competitors, deliberately distracting or provoking other competitors is not acceptable or permitted behaviours in any sport.



- Work equally hard for yourself and/or for your team. Your team's performance will benefit; so will you.
- Be a good sport. Applaud all good efforts whether they are by your team or other competitors. Treat all participants in your sport, as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor.
- Cooperate with your coach, teammates and other competitors. Without them there would be no competition.
- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please parents and coaches.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
