

THE OFF THE TRACK WA PASSPORT IS HERE!

The Off the Track WA (OTTWA) Passport is designed to assist Racing and Wagering Western Australia (RWWA) in tracing and connecting retired racehorses in WA, and gain a better understanding of their location and life after racing.

All owners of retired racehorses are encouraged to create an OTTWA Passport account and register the horses in their care.

In addition to supporting racehorses in the transition from racing to retirement, owners signing up their horses will be eligible for exclusive benefits, including access to OTTWA clinics and events, exclusive educational resources such as how-to videos and an OTTWA welcome pack.

HOW TO REGISTER YOUR HORSES FOR A PASSPORT

- 1. Visit offthetrack.com.au and create an OTTWA Passport account.
- Log in to your account, and search for your horse using its racing name, microchip number or other details known to you.
- 3. Once you find your horse, update its details and upload current photos of its brands.
- Submit your application to RWWA for review, and allow up to two weeks for the application to be processed.
- 5. If approved, you will receive a printed version of your horse's ID Certificate. This can also be viewed on your online profile.

STABLES AND CAMPING

All Stable and Camping Bookings are to be made directly with the State Equestrian Centre.

- All Stable and Camping bookings are to be made directly with the State Equestrian Centre. Please book via <u>Nerissa.Foster@equestrianwa.org.au</u>
- If you are using a generator at this event it must be Residual Current Device (RCD) protected and extension leads must be safety tagged.
- All waste in stables and yards at the SEC and at Swan Valley fields, must be removed before leaving the event.
- The State Equestrian Centre encourages people to secure their personal belongings.
- Yards are available free of charge at Swan Valley Fields.
- Horses not booked in stables are not to be tied up in the stable area at any time.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS FOR 2021

- Riders are only allowed to enter into a total of three rounds per day (plus the six bar on Sunday not included in total rounds) –
 3 individual classes per day
 - OR

1 Team event (Zone or Teams Challenge/Brigid Woss) plus 1 individual class each day

- This is a Pony Club event held at the State Equestrian Centre. The policy of **NO DOGS** will be adhered to. Failure to abide by this policy may result in the elimination of rider(s).
- Each helper will be able to select their rostered duty through "Sign-up". All entrants will be emailed the link to the Pony Club WA State Showjumping SignUp page.
- Presentations will be done at the end of each class.
- All Team, Zone and Individual entries will be done through My Pony Club so will save time for clubs and individuals submitting their entries. Payment is made at the time of entry.
- Rally qualifications are from the **20th May 2020 until the 9th May 2021**.

ENTRY SUMMARY

INDIVIDUAL

Entries are via <u>MyPonyClub</u>. Please make sure that your rider profile is up to date including the details of the horse you are competing on.

Riders are only allowed to enter into a total of three rounds per day (plus the six bar on Sunday not included in total rounds) –

3 individual classes per day

OR

1 Team event (Zone or Teams Challenge/Brigid Woss) plus one individual class each day

Changes are not able to be made by riders, so please choose your classes carefully. Please email sports@ponyclubwa.asn.au if changes need to be made before the close of entries. Changes will not be made after this date unless a Medical or Veterinary Certificate is provided.

SWAPPING OF ENTRIES ON THE DAY:

There will NOT be swapping of classes or entries on the day.

CLUB AND TEAM ENTRIES

- Club and Zone Team entries are via a separate event entry on My Pony Club. Clubs and Zones will advise riders if they are part of a Team and they will be given access to the Team entries.
- There may be restrictions to the number of teams a Club can enter in each event. Team 1 will be automatically accepted. Any further teams are subject to approval by the State Showjumping Committee.
- Clubs will be emailed to advise them of the final number of teams accepted and then they will then need to inform their riders.
- Clubs & Zones need to email a list of riders in their Teams to <u>sports@ponyclubwa.asn.au</u> so they can be confirmed against riders entries.
- If a club or zone has insufficient riders to form a team, the State Showjumping Committee will endeavour to create a composite team with riders from the same Zone or conduct a ballot for composite teams.
- Proof of Competency form must be forward for the riders from Zones who did not have sufficient riders for a Zone Run-off.

DECLARATION OF RALLY QUALIFICATION AND COMPETENCY

The club will be emailed a list of riders who have entered and they need to verify their Rally Qualifications and competency at the level they have nominated.

HELPER DUTIES

It is the responsibility of all riders to supply a helper per horse/rider combination.

The Helper Duties will be via "Signup" & all riders entered will be emailed the link to be able to select their job.

Clubs will be asked to provide the name of a Club Helper Coordinator and contact number to be a point of contact for the Helper Jobs for their Club over the weekend.

REMEMBER: If a rider scratches after the close of entries, they are still responsible to provide a helper on the day or coordinate with your club to cover the rostered duty.

GENERAL

- No late or incomplete entries will be accepted.
- The Chairperson, committee members and office staff do not have authority to accept/forward late entries.
- All payments must be completed before the close of entries. Proof of current Equestrian Australia (EA) membership will be checked with EA staff. If you provide details of EWA membership that is not valid or current your entry will be suspended until the matter is corrected and any additional Ground fees or levies are paid.

ENTRY INFORMATION

The organiser reserves the right:

- To cancel any class or event
- To divide any class
- To transfer competitors between classes or sections
- To alter the advertised times
- To refuse any entry, with or without stating the reason
- To amend placing's dependant on class numbers

SUPPLEMENTARY RULES

Please note: The only exception to the EA National Jumping Rules and FEI Rules for Showjumping are the Pony Club WA Showjumping speeds, as set at in the table below:

HEIGHT	SPEED (metres per minute)
105cm and above	350mpm
85cm to 105cm	325mpm
Up to and including 80cm	300mpm

TIMETABLE CLASHES

Showjumping classes available are for Zone Teams, Club Teams and Individual Competitors.

In the event of a clash in the timetable, riders that have been selected in the Zone team must ride in the Zone class, if riders do not present on time, this may result in the elimination of the team.

The order of preference should be as follows:

- 1. Zone
- 2. Club Teams
- 3. Individual classes

It is good etiquette to inform the arena marshals if you have a clash, individual classes do not need to go in draw order, but a class cannot be held open for extended periods waiting for individuals to present and there will be no refunds if classes are missed.

HORSES

- Plaiting is not mandatory but is expected for the Brigid Woss Equitation Team Event and it would be appreciated if all horses were plaited for all Championship classes, as we are on public display.
- Each horse or pony may only be ridden by one rider for the duration of the Championships.
- A competitor may enter and ride two horses over the Championship weekend.
- Rider/horse combination must be competent at the height(s) that they have elected to enter.
- Riders with two horses competing must supply a helper for each mount.

RIDERS

- Riders cannot compete in more than one height in the same event format. For example, you cannot ride in the AM7 60cm and then the AM7 70cm, but you can enter the AM7 60cm and Optimum Time 70cm. They can ride consecutive if ridden in a different arena.
- **NOTE**: You can only compete in one round in each class, no HC available.
- A rider may only ride in one team in the Brigid Woss & Team Challenge. A rider cannot enter these classes on a second mount.

PRESENTATIONS

Presentations for most classes will be mounted and will take place after the class in the main arena.

GEAR CHECKING

All saddlery must comply with the current Pony Club WA Gear Checking Manual.

PLEASE BRING YOUR CURRENT GEAR EXEMPTION WITH YOU WHEN YOU PRESENT FOR GEAR CHECKING IF YOU HAVE ONE. Riders must be accompanied by the Team Manager for Gear Checking prior to the start of the team and zone competition.

CANCELLATIONS, SCRATCHINGS OR ALTERATIONS

If for any reason you wish to withdraw from a class during the event, please inform the Event office as soon as possible. NO ENTRIES ON THE DAY OR SWAPPING OF CLASSES WILL BE PERMITTED. If you are withdrawing from a team, a form must be obtained from the event office and completed by the Team Manager. If your team has a duly qualified substitute, substitution forms will be available in the event office and must be completed by the Team Manager at least 30 minutes before the rider is scheduled to commence the class.

VET

A Veterinary Officer will be on call throughout the Championships to provide services to injured or sick horses. Any veterinary expenses are the responsibility of the individual.

FARRIER

There will be no official farrier on grounds over the weekend. If you need the services of a farrier, please call whomever you usually use.

SWABBING

Pony Club WA adheres to a policy of random swabbing. Swabbing may be carried out at any State competition.

AWARDS

MICHELE WILKIE HIGH POINT EQUITATION PERPETUAL TROPHY

- Awarded to the highest scoring individual rider in the Equitation round of the Showjumping Team Event
- Equitation in Pony Club is the opportunity for riders and ponies to show good temperament and how well they work together. The riders and ponies are judged on uniform, equipment, general suitability for each other and it is the opportunity for the genuine pony clubber to achieve high places without having to jump high levels as rhythm, balance and pace are all considered.

BRIGID WOSS EQUITATION BURSARY

- Ms Brigid Woss generously provides a bursary of \$500 awarded to first place; \$250 awarded to second place and a \$250 encouragement award. This class has two sections: Presentation and Equitation.
- All information regarding this event and the conditions associated with it are located in the <u>Showjumping Reference Document</u> available on the Pony Club WA website under Showjumping.

OFF THE TRACK

- Awarded to eligible horses (registered TB or SB) that compete in Brigid Woss Equitation/Team Challenge this information needs to be included on the additional information requested on "My Pony Club entry. Placings will be given from 1st to 3rd.
- All thoroughbreds and standardbreds bred for the purpose of racing qualify for the Off the Track Events and Clinics, and any of the classes we sponsor.
- When entering you will be asked to provide the details of your horses' Passport, race name and or microchip.
