CAMPING AND SHOWERS

Camping is available at a cost of **\$10 per family** for the weekend.

Hot showers are available at the grounds.

Please make sure that all yards and camping areas are clean when you leave. All horse manure must be put in the manure pits.

CLASSES

For all classes, the age of the rider is taken as at 01 January 2022. Individual classes may be split into genders where more than 3 competitors of each gender are participating.

2022 CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

There will be an individual competition in each of the 7 Championship Classes. All riders in the championship classes must meet rally and event qualification requirements. For the team competition the 95cm and 105cm classes will be combined, a team can consist of any composition of 95cm and 105cm competitors (e.g., all 95cm, all 105cm or a combination of 95 and 105cm). The team competition at 80cm may combine age groups depending on entry numbers.

AWARDS - PONY CLUB WA CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

- Rosettes to 6th for individual riders, saddle blankets for individual winners
- Rosettes to 3rd for team placings, rugs for the winning teams

Riders in the Championship Classes are eligible for the following special awards:

- Lucy Oorschot Trophy - for the female athlete with the highest combined run and swim score in the 95cm and 105cm Championship Classes.
- Highest scoring shooter (7m, 10m)
- Highest scoring swimmer (100m, 200m)
- Highest scoring runner (1000m, 2000m)
- Highest scoring rider (65cm, 80cm, 95-105cm)
- All thoroughbreds and standardbreds bred for the purpose of racing that compete in the Championship classes qualify for the Off the Track Award. When entering you will be asked to include your Off the Track passport number.



2022 NON CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

There are 13 non-championship classes. Classes will only have individual competitions. There are no qualification requirements for the Non Championship classes.

ENTRY INFORMATION

QUALIFICATION PERIOD

The Qualification Period for both Event Qualification and Rally Qualification is from the **27 March 2021 to the 27 March 2022.**

- The Chairperson and committee members do **not** have authority to accept late entries.
- Entries must be completed correctly and in full.
- Entries are online via Ktrials www.ktrials.com.au
- After entries have been received, clubs will be sent a Club Entry Endorsement Spreadsheet for the riders from their club who have entered the Championship. This must be signed by their Club Chief Coach and Club President/Secretary by **28 March 2022**, or their entries will be transferred to a Non-Championship class.
- If your qualification event for an entry in a championship class is not successful, your entry will be transferred to a Non-Championship class.

The organiser reserves the right:

- To cancel any class or event
- To divide or combine any class
- To transfer competitors between sections of a class
- To alter the advertised times
- To refuse any entry, with or without stating the reason

STATE TETRATHLON CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION

QUALIFICATIONS

All horse/rider combinations in championship classes must have attended a minimum of three Working Rallies (as defined by the [Working Rally Definition](#)) in the 12 months prior to **28th March 2022**.

All horse/rider combinations in championship classes must have successfully completed one competition round of Tetrathlon, Eventing Cross Country, Hickstead or Hunter Trial (excludes training rounds) at their nominated jumping height or higher, in the 12 months prior to **28 March 2022**.

All riders in championship classes must have successfully completed one individual Tetrathlon in the 18 months prior to **28 March 2022**. This requirement is to ensure competency in the three non-ridden phases, therefore does not have to be at the jumping height or on the horse they are competing on.

HORSES

The 'one horse, one rider rule' will apply for all classes, e.g., horses may be entered for one class only and may not be entered in any other class.

RIDERS

Riders may only compete in one class.

Championship Riders must be current financial Junior or Senior Members with Pony Club WA.

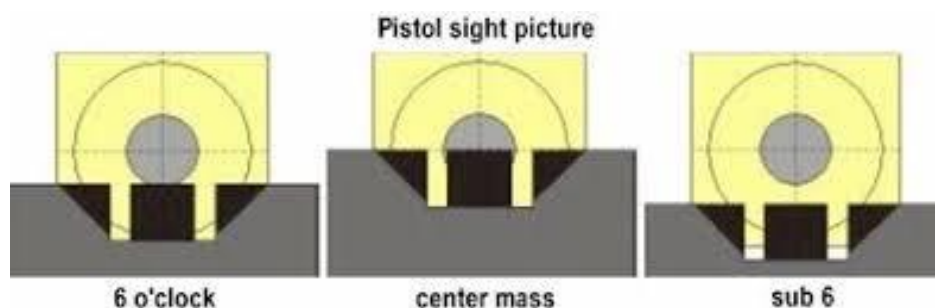
Open Riders are riders over the age of 18 years as of 01 January 2022 and are current financial members with Pony Club WA in one of the following categories:

- Adult Member
- Top-Up Member
- Open Rider Member

SHOOTING

The pool pistols provided for the competition will be calibrated to the sub 6 o'clock position. This means that the pistols are set to hit above the point of aim (e.g., if you aim below the bullseye, you should hit the bullseye. This is done as it is easier to accurately line up the sights when you have a white background.)

Competitors are allowed to use their own laser pistol. Pistols will be inspected prior to use and must be a UIPM endorsed laser pistol and have no modifications to the standard issue barrel or trigger.



SWIMMING

Competitors will be asked to provide an approximate swimming time for the completion of their swim in the entry pack. This time will be used to group swimmers of a similar ability. To ensure the swimming phase is run efficiently and that all competitors are capable of completing their swim, please take the time to do a timed practice swim prior to the close of entries.

If a competitor swimming 200m has not completed the swim within 7:50 they will be asked to retire and awarded 20 points for their swim phase. If a competitor swimming 100m has not completed their swim within 6:10 they will be asked to retire and awarded 20 points. A competitor may retire at any point after entering the pool and be awarded 20 points for participation.

TEAMS

- Teams of four or three riders will be drawn for the competition. Clubs may nominate a team or teams in any class where they have sufficient competitors. Please provide the team's name on the Club Entry Endorsement Spreadsheet.
- If there are not enough competitors for a team within a class (<6 competitors), two classes may be combined for the team event. This will not affect individual results/placings.
- If a club does not have enough riders for a team, where possible composite teams will be created.
- Only championship classes will have team events.

TEAM MANAGERS

- Team managers must have a WWC (Working with Children) number or parent exemption. This must be recorded on the Club Entry Endorsement Spreadsheet.
- Clubs need to provide one Team Manager for every 3 – 4 competitors from their club.
- The Team Manager must **NOT** be riding in any activity on the day.
- Team Managers must supply a **mobile phone number** which they can be contacted on **at all times** during the event.
- Must be familiar with Pony Club WA Tetrathlon Team Manager Duties (available on the Pony Club WA website).
- Team Managers must collect the State Tetrathlon Team Manager's Pack containing course information and contact details for their team.
- Individuals will collect their own bib numbers.
- Team Managers must be present at the gear checking and marshalling of the riding phase.
- Team Managers must ensure a responsible adult is present with all members of the team at the non-riding phases if they are not able to attend all phases themselves.
- Team Managers must present to the Phase Steward with the competitor in the case of a query, protest or any other dispute.

HELPER DUTIES

- Nominated helpers are asked to complete two helper duties, one on Saturday and one on Sunday. This will ensure that all helper duties are short, and parents are able to support their own child during the riding phase.
- Each competitor must provide a helper (16 years and over) capable of performing any rostered duty.
- Riders will be emailed a link to the online platform SignUp to be able to select their own helper duties. The Organising Committee retain the right to adjust the helper duties to suit operational requirements.
- One helper cannot be the designated helper for more than two competitors.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

A **WWC Check** is required by a person if they engage in certain paid or unpaid work with children, described as 'child-related work' under the WWC Act.

Volunteers engaged in helper duties at Pony Club WA State Championships where the **usual duties** involve, or are they likely to involve, contact with a child, such as Team Manager, Gear Checking, Marshalling will be required to have a current WWCC unless a parent exemption applies.

Parent exemption applies if you are volunteering and have a child under the age of 18 actively involved in the event you are volunteering at.

THE OFF THE TRACK WA PASSPORT IS HERE!

The Off the Track WA (OTTWA) Passport is designed to assist Racing and Wagering Western Australia (RWAA) in tracing and connecting retired racehorses in WA, and gain a better understanding of their location and life after racing.

All owners of retired racehorses are encouraged to create an OTTWA Passport account and register the horses in their care.

In addition to supporting racehorses in the transition from racing to retirement, owners signing up their horses will be eligible for exclusive benefits, including access to OTTWA clinics and events, exclusive educational resources such as how-to videos and an OTTWA welcome pack.

HOW TO REGISTER YOUR HORSES FOR A PASSPORT

1. Visit offthetrack.com.au and create an OTTWA Passport account.
2. Log in to your account, and search for your horse using its racing name, microchip number or other details known to you.
3. Once you find your horse, update its details and upload current photos of its brands.
4. Submit your application to RWAA for review, and allow up to two weeks for the application to be processed.
5. If approved, you will receive a printed version of your horse's ID Certificate.
