

STATE SHOWJUMPING CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION

NEW QUALIFICATION CRITERIA

2023 Qualification requirements:

- The horse/rider combination must attend 3 working rallies,
- 60cm classes will be limited to riders 12 years and under.
- A minimum of 2 rounds at the competing height or a higher height and maximum of 10 penalties in any competition round at an official event (Pony Club or EWA). No training rounds, Eventing or Tetrathlon competition rounds will be permitted to be used. The competition must use an accredited EWA or Pony Club Judge and Course Designer.

Performance Diary to be signed on the day of the competition by the Showjumping Judge or the Course Designer. No retrospective signatures will be accepted. The diaries are to be maintained by the rider and given to the Club in support of their entry and competency declaration.

Neither the Organising Committee of the event to which these rules apply, nor Pony Club WA accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury, or illness to horses, riders, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever.

The organiser reserves the right:

- To cancel any class or event
- To divide or combine any class.
- To transfer competitors between classes or sections of a class
- To alter the advertised times
- To refuse any entry, with or without stating the reason
- To amend placing's dependant on class numbers

ONLINE ENTRY INFORMATION

Entries are via Global Entries Online

Please ensure your rider profile is up to date including the details of the horse you are competing on. Changes can be made by the rider up to **the close of entries on Sunday, 30 April 2023 at midnight**. Changes will not be made after this date unless a Medical or Veterinary Certificate is provided.

QUALIFICATIONS

Horse/rider combinations must have attended a minimum of three Working Rallies (as defined by the Working Rally Definition) in the period 24 April 2022 to 30 April 2023.

STABLES AND CAMPING

- Intentions for Stable and Camping bookings will be made via the Online Entry. No payment is needed at the time of entry for stables and camping. This will be invoiced by EWA directly to the individual riders.
- If you are using a generator at this event, it must be Residual Current Device (RCD) protected and extension leads must be safety tagged.
- All waste in stables and yards must be removed before leaving the event.
- The State Equestrian Centre encourages people to secure their personal belongings.
- Yards are available free of charge at Swan Valley Fields.
- Horses not booked in stables are not to be tied up in the stable area at any time.

HORSES

The one horse, one rider rule will apply for all classes.

A rider may enter a maximum of 2 horses/ponies per day in the Championships.

Riders with two horses competing must supply a helper for each mount.

For this competition a Pony is defined as being up to and including 14.2h.

For this competition a Horse is defined as being over 14.2h.

RIDERS

Riders must be a current financial Junior or Senior Riding Members with Pony Club WA.

Rider age is as at 01 January 2023

If a rider scratches from the event after the close of entries, they are still responsible for their helper duty or co-ordinate with their club to cover the rostered duty.

Rider profiles are mandatory this year and should be 25 words or less.

TIMETABLE CLASHES

Showjumping classes available are for Zone Teams, Club Teams, and Individual Competitors. In the event of a clash in the timetable, riders that have been selected in the Zone team must ride in the Zone class. If riders do not present on time, it may result in the elimination of the team. The order of preference should be as follows:

1) Zone Teams 2) Club Teams 3) Individual Classes It is good etiquette to inform the arena marshals if you have a clash. Individual classes do not need to go in draw order, but a class cannot be held open for extended periods waiting for individuals to present. There will be no refunds if classes are missed.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

A **WWC Check** is required by a person if they engage in certain paid or unpaid work with children, described as 'child-related work' under the WWC Act.

Volunteers engaged in helper duties at Pony Club WA State Championships where the **usual duties** involve, or are they are likely to involve, <u>contact</u> with a <u>child</u>, such as Team Manager, Gear Checking, Marshalling will be required to have a current WWCC unless a Parent Exemption applies.

A Parent Exemption applies if you are volunteering and have a child under the age of 18 actively involved in the event you are volunteering at.

HELPER DUTIES

It is the responsibility of all riders to supply a helper per horse/rider combination (e.g., If you have two horses entered you must do two helper duties or if a family has multiple riders, helpers must be provided for each horse/rider combination. Team Managers traditionally have not had to do helpers duties, but due to the extensive program and roles needing to be filled to make a successful event, we are not able to continue with this tradition. Team Managers will need to select a helper duty to do over the Championship. The Helper Duties will be via Sign Up.

If a rider scratches after the close of entries, they are still responsible to provide a helper on the day or coordinate with your club to cover the rostered duty.

COVID-19 EVENT GUIDELINES & COVID-19 REFUND POLICY

Government guidelines concerning Covid-19 restrictions and precautions will be followed. If you are having flu like symptoms and are unsure if you have Covid-19, please do not attend the event. A refund may be granted if you:

- test positive for Covid-19 and must isolate.
- are showing symptoms.
- are the carer of someone in isolation.

Members requesting a refund should provide supporting evidence to sports@ponyclubwa.asn.au such as a medical certificate, PCR test result, photo of RAT result, text or email from Health Authorities, or other evidence confirming Covid-19 or need to isolate. Refunds must be requested within 7 days of the event. Refunds may be subject to a \$10 administration fee.

PONY CLUB WA - NO DOG POLICY

- This is a Pony Club WA event, and the policy of NO DOGS will be strictly adhered to. Failure to abide by this policy may result in the elimination of rider(s). Assistance animals approved by the Department of Local Government; Sport & Cultural Industries are exempt from this rule. Persons with an Assistance Animal may be requested to provide their approval documentation.
- If you have family members or friends attending, could you please remind them of the NO DOG Policy.

ELECTRIC BIKES & E SCOOTERS

• Electric Bikes and E Scooters are not permitted on the President's Lawn, General Purpose Grass Arenas, or Stables during competition. This has been requested by the State Equestrian Centre Management.

RIDERS

- Please set-up a rider profile.
- If you have used **Global Entries** in the past, please make sure all information is up to date, as we use the email address to send out information.
- Remember you are allowed only do 2 classes per day (one Team or Zone Event + one Individual) per day. The Six Bar is not included in the 2 classes.
- Consecutive heights are permitted, but only with support of qualification card and club declaration.
- Teams, Zones, and Individual classes will open on Saturday, 15 April and close on Sunday, 30
 April 2023 at midnight.
- Riders can make changes up until the close of entries on **Sunday, 30 April 2023.**
- Please make sure you answer the Mandatory question for Rider Profile. We will have commentary for the Welcome Stakes, Brigid Woss & Team Challenge, Joy Through Participation and Zone Classes.

TEAM EVENT – BRIGID WOSS & TEAM CHALLENGE

- Clubs are requested to download and complete the Team Entry spreadsheet on the website.
- Due to the introduction of a second team event on Saturday, only full teams will be accepted.
- Please send through to sports@ponyclubwa.asn.au duly signed and completed by midnight on the Wednesday, 26 April 2023. No late entries will be accepted.
- Riders will have until **Sunday, 30 April 2023** to enter for their Team Event as well as Individual classes.
- Changes by rider can be done up to the close of entries on Sunday, 30 April 2023.
- Only riders who have been notified by their club of their selection to be on the Brigid Woss
 Team Challenge teams may enter through Global Entries online.

JOY THROUGH PARTICIPATION

- This Team Event is for clubs who have riders wanting to represent their club in a Team Event, but do not have the required height riders to be in the Brigid Woss & Team Challenge.
- Riders accepted in Joy Through Participation will be a team of 4 riders 2 riders at 80cm and 2 riders at 90cm.
- Teams may be made of composite riders by the Committee through a balloting system.
- Clubs are requested to fill out the Joy Through Participation Entry spreadsheet on the website.
- Please send through to sports@ponyclubwa.asn.au duly signed and completed by midnight on Wednesday, 26 April 2023. No late entries will be accepted.
- Riders will have until Sunday, 30 April 2023 to enter for their Team Events as well as Individual classes.
- Changes by rider can be done up to the close of entries on Sunday, 30 April 2023.
- Only riders who have been notified by their club of their selection to be on the Joy Through Participation Team may enter through Global Entries Online.

ZONE CLASSES

- Zones are requested to fill out the Zone Entry spreadsheet on the website.
- Please send through to sports@ponyclubwa.asn.au duly signed and completed by the <a href="https://www.wednesday.google
- Riders will have until the **Sunday, 30 April 2023** to enter their Zone Class(es) as well as Individual classes.
- Changes by rider can be done up to the close of entries on Sunday, 30 April 2023.

INDIVIDUAL

- Entries for Individual classes will open on the **Saturday**, **15 April 2023 at 9am**, and close on **Sunday**, **30 April 2023 at midnight**.
- Clubs will be sent a declaration with riders' chosen classes to sign off on competency and rally qualification.
- Declarations are due in by Wednesday, 26 April 2023
- A reminder to clubs that Rally Qualification is from 24 April 2022 30 April 2023.



SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

Please note: The only exception to the EA National Jumping Rules and FEI Rules for Showjumping are the Pony Club WA Showjumping speeds, as set out in the table below:

HEIGHT	SPEED (metres per minute)
105cm and above	325mpm
85cm to 105cm	325mpm
Up to and including 80cm	325mpm

HORSES

Plaiting is not mandatory but is expected for the Brigid Woss Equitation & Team Event and it would be appreciated if all horses were plaited for all Championship classes, as we are on public display. Each horse or pony may only be ridden by one rider for the duration of the Championships. A competitor may enter and ride two horses over the Championship weekend excluding the Brigid Woss & the Team Challenge.

Rider/horse combination must be competent at the height(s) that they have elected to enter.

RIDERS

- Remember you are allowed only do 2 classes per day (one Team or Zone Event & one Individual) per day. The Six Bar is not included in the 2 classes.
- Consecutive heights are permitted, but only with support of qualification card and club declaration.

NOTE: You can only compete in one round in each class, no HC entries permitted.

PRESENTATIONS

Presentations will take place at the conclusion of each class. Rosettes not collected can be picked up at the Event Office.

Presentation of the Michele Wilkie High Point Equitation and the OTTWA High Point will take place on Saturday at the conclusion of competition in all arenas.

GEAR CHECKING

All saddlery must comply with the current Pony Club WA Gear Checking Manual.

Riders under the age of 18 years must present to the Gear Checker with a Parent or Guardian.

Riders must be accompanied by the Team Manager for Gear Checking prior to the start of the Teams and Zone competitions.

If a rider has a gear exemption, it must be presented to the Gear Checker at each class entered.

CANCELLATIONS, SCRATCHINGS OR ALTERATIONS

If for any reason you wish to withdraw from a class during the event, please inform the Event office as soon as possible.

No entries on the day or swapping of classes will be permitted.

If you are withdrawing from a team, a form must be obtained from the event office and completed by the Team Manager. If your team has a duly qualified substitute, substitution forms will be available in the event office and must be completed by the Team Manager at least 30 minutes before the rider is scheduled to commence the class.

VETERINARY

A local Veterinary Officer will be on call throughout the Championships to provide services to injured or sick horses. Any veterinary expenses are the responsibility of the individual.

FARRIER

There will NOT be an official farrier on the grounds or on call over the weekend.

SWABBING

Pony Club WA adheres to a policy of random swabbing at our State competitions.

QUALIFICATION FORMS

There will be random checks of Showjumping Qualification forms with your clubs.

AWARDS

MICHELE WILKIE HIGH POINT EQUITATION PERPETUAL TROPHY

- Awarded to the highest scoring individual rider in the Equitation round of the Showjumping Team Event
- Equitation in Pony Club is the opportunity for riders and ponies to show good temperament and how well they work together. The riders and ponies are judged on uniform, equipment, general suitability for each other and it is the opportunity for the genuine pony clubber to achieve high places without having to jump high levels as rhythm, balance and pace are all considered.

SHOWJUMPING TEAM EVENT PERPETUAL TROPHY

• This trophy is given to the team placing first in the Showjumping Team Event held in conjunction with Brigid Woss Equitation. The trophy has been kindly donated by Swan Zone.

BRIGID WOSS EQUITATION BURSARY

- Brigid Woss generously provides a bursary of \$500 awarded to first place; \$250 awarded to second place and a \$250 encouragement award. This class has two sections: Presentation and Equitation.

OFF THE TRACK

• All thoroughbreds and standardbreds bred for the purpose of racing that compete at the Championships qualify for the Off the Track Award. When entering you will be asked to include your Off the Track passport number and racing name of your horse.
