PRIZES & AWARDS

Highpoint Awards: Points will be accumulated over Saturday and Sunday competitions. The age groups are Rider 12 years and under; Rider 13 - 17 years; and Rider 18 years and over. Winners will be presented with their award at the Annual Awards Evening in December.

Zone Team Challenge: Team rugs will be presented to the winners of the Zone Team Challenge.

Off The Track Award: For eligible horses that compete in Individual and Team classes on Friday and Saturday. Prizes will be awarded from first to third and will be presented on Saturday afternoon.

Club Team Challenge: Team Rugs will be presented to the winners of the Club Team Challenge. The Showjumping Team Event Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the winning team.

Golden Tickets: 5 Golden tickets are hidden in the rider's bags. Prizes must be claimed during the competition.

EWA membership details will be verified with EWA. If you provide incorrect details your entry will be suspended until the matter is corrected and any additional or outstanding fees are paid.

STATE SHOWJUMPING CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION

QUALIFICATION CRITERIA

2024 Qualification requirements:

- All horse/rider combinations in championship classes must have attended a minimum of three Working Rallies in the 12 months prior to 21 April 2024.
- A minimum of 2 rounds at the competing height or a higher height and a maximum of 20 penalties in any competition round at an official event (Pony Club or EWA). No training rounds, Eventing or Tetrathlon competition rounds will be permitted to be used. The competition must use an accredited EWA or Pony Club Judge and Course Designer.

The Showjumping Performance Record must be signed by the Showjumping Judge or the Course Designer. The information is to be maintained by the rider and given to the Club as evidence of their qualification.

Neither the Organising Committee of the event to which these rules apply, nor Pony Club WA accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury, or illness to horses, riders, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever.

The organizer reserves the right:

- To cancel any class or event
- To divide or combine any class.
- To transfer competitors between classes or sections of a class
- To alter the advertised times
- To refuse any entry, with or without stating the reason
- To amend placings dependant on class numbers

ONLINE ENTRY INFORMATION

Entries are via Nominate.

Changes can be made by the rider up to the close of entries on Sunday, 21 April 2024 at 11pm. Changes will not be made after this date unless a Medical or Veterinary Certificate is provided.

STABLES AND CAMPING

All Stables and Camping should be booked online through the SEC.

[Equestrian WA \(intrac.com.au\)](http://Equestrian WA (intrac.com.au))

- If you are using a generator at this event, it must be Residual Current Device (RCD) protected and extension leads must be safety tagged.
- All waste in stables and yards must be removed before leaving the event.
- The State Equestrian Centre encourages people to secure their personal belongings.
- Yards are available free of charge at Swan Valley Fields.
- Horses not booked in stables are not to be tied up in the stable area at any time.

HORSES

The one horse, one rider rule will apply for all classes.

A rider may enter a maximum of 2 horses/ponies per day in the Championships.

Riders with two horses competing must supply a helper for each mount.

Height certificates may be requested.

For this competition a Pony is defined as being up to and including 14.2hh.

For this competition a Horse is defined as being over 14.2hh.

RIDERS

Riders must be a current financial Junior or Senior Riding Members with Pony Club WA.

Rider age is as at 01 January 2024.

If a rider scratches from the event after the close of entries, they are still responsible for their helper duty or to co-ordinate with their club to cover the rostered duty.

Rider profiles are mandatory this year and should be 25 words or less.

TIMETABLE CLASHES

Showjumping classes available are for Zone Teams, Club Teams, and Individual Competitors.

In the event of a clash in the timetable, riders that have been selected in the Zone team must ride in the Zone class. If riders do not present on time, it may result in the elimination of the team.

The order of preference should be as follows:

- 1) Zone Teams
- 2) Club Teams
- 3) Individual Classes

It is good etiquette to inform the arena marshals if you have a clash. Individual classes do not need to go in draw order, but a class cannot be held open for extended periods waiting for individuals to present. There will be no refunds if classes are missed.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

A **WWC Check** is required by a person if they engage in certain paid or unpaid work with children, described as 'child-related work' under the WWC Act.

Volunteers engaged in helper duties at Pony Club WA State Championships where the **usual duties** involve, or are they are likely to involve contact with a child such as Team Manager, Gear Checking, and Marshalling, will be required to have a current WWCC unless a Parent Exemption applies.

A Parent Exemption applies if you are volunteering and have a child under the age of 18 actively involved in the event you are volunteering at.

HELPER DUTIES

It is the responsibility of all riders to supply a helper per horse/rider combination (e.g. If you have two horses entered you must do two helper duties or if a family has multiple riders, helpers must be provided for each horse/rider combination.

The Helper Duties will be via Sign Up. Team Managers are expected to do a helper duty.

If a rider scratches after the close of entries, they are still responsible for providing a helper on the day or coordinating with your club to cover the rostered duty.

If you are using a paid helper and they are not a member of a Pony Club, please supply their name, and contact number on sign up, and a copy of their Working with Children must be emailed to membership@ponyclubwa.asn.au.

PONY CLUB WA – NO DOG POLICY

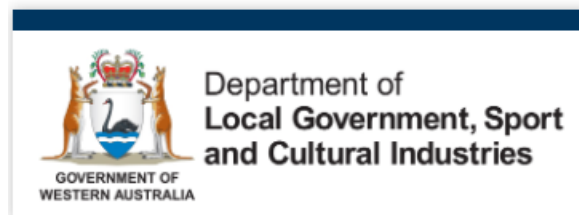

HOW TO ENTER

Entries are via Nominate

Changes can be made by the rider up to the close of entries on Sunday, 21 April 2024 at 11pm. Changes will not be made after this date unless a Medical or Veterinary Certificate is provided.

RIDERS

- Please set-up a rider profile.
- If you have used **Nominate** in the past, please make sure all information is up to date, as we use the email address to send out information.
- Consecutive heights are permitted. All entries are subject to endorsement by the Club Declaration after confirming the Qualification Card.
- Entries will open at 6pm on Monday 8 April and close at 11pm on Sunday 21 April 2024.
- Riders can make changes up until the close of entries on Sunday 21 April 2024.
- Please make sure you answer the Mandatory question for Rider Profile. We will have commentary for the “No Frills Friday”, Club Team Challenge and Zone classes

TEAM EVENT – Club Team Challenge

- Clubs are requested to download and complete the Team Entry spreadsheet on the website.
- Please send through to sports@ponyclubwa.asn.au duly signed and completed by midnight on Wednesday 24 April 2024. No late entries will be accepted.
- Riders will have until 11pm on Sunday 21 April 2024 to enter their Team Event as well as Individual classes.
- Only riders who have been notified by their club of their selection to be on the Club Team Challenge or Zone Teams can enter these classes.

ZONE CLASSES

- Zones are requested to fill out the Zone Entry spreadsheet on the website.
- Please send through to sports@ponyclubwa.asn.au duly signed and completed by **Wednesday 24 April 2024**. No late entries will be accepted.
- Riders will have until **Sunday 21 April 2024** to enter their Zone Class(es) as well as Individual classes.
- Changes by rider can be done up to the close of entries on **Sunday 21 April 2023**.

INDIVIDUAL

- Entries for Individual classes will open on Monday 8 April 2024 at 6pm, and close on Sunday **21 April 2024 at 11 pm**. Clubs will be sent a declaration with riders’ chosen classes to sign off on competency and rally qualification.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

Please note: The only exception to the EA National Jumping Rules and FEI Rules for Showjumping are the Pony Club WA Showjumping speeds, as set out in the table below:

HEIGHT	SPEED (metres per minute)
105cm and above	325mpm
85cm to 105cm	325mpm
Up to and including 80cm	325mpm

HORSES

Plaiting is not mandatory but is expected for the Club Team Challenge & Zone Event and it would be appreciated if all horses were plaited for all Championship classes as we are on public display.

Each horse or pony may only be ridden by one rider for the duration of the Championships.

A competitor may enter and ride two horses over the Championship weekend excluding the Team Challenge.

Rider/horse combinations must be verified by their Club as being competent at the height(s) that they have entered.

RIDERS

Remember you are allowed to only do 3 starts per day (one Team or Zone Event & one Individual). The Club Team Challenge and Zone Teams classes each count as 2 starts.

Consecutive heights are permitted, but only with the support of the qualification card and club declarations.

NOTE: You can only compete in one round in each class. No non-competitive/Hors Concours rounds are permitted.

PRESENTATIONS

Presentations will take place at the conclusion of each class. Rosettes not collected need to be collected from the Event Office.

Presentation of the Off the Track Awards will take place at the conclusion of the rings on Saturday afternoon.

GEAR CHECKING

All saddlery must comply with the current Pony Club Australia Gear Rules and the Pony Club WA Gear Checking Manual Pony Club WA Appendixes to support the Pony Club Australia National Gear Rules.

Riders under the age of 18 years must present to the Gear Checker with a Parent or Guardian.

Riders must be accompanied by the Team Manager for Gear Checking prior to the start of the Teams and Zone competitions.

If a rider has a Gear Exemption, it must be presented to the Gear Checker at each class entered.

CANCELLATIONS, SCRATCHINGS OR ALTERATIONS

If for any reason you wish to withdraw from a class during the event, please inform the Event office as soon as possible.

No entries on the day or swapping of classes will be permitted.

If you are withdrawing from a team, a form must be obtained from the event office and completed by the Team Manager. If your team has a duly qualified substitute, substitution forms will be available in the event office and must be completed by the Team Manager at least 30 minutes before the rider is scheduled to commence the class.

AWARDS

MICHELE WILKIE HIGH POINT EQUITATION PERPETUAL TROPHY

Awarded to the highest-scoring individual rider in the Equitation round of the Showjumping Team Event.

Equitation in Pony Club is the opportunity for riders and ponies to show good temperament and how well they work together. The riders and ponies are judged on uniform, equipment, and general suitability for each other and it is the opportunity for them to achieve high places without having to jump high levels as rhythm, balance and pace are all considered.

SHOWJUMPING TEAM EVENT PERPETUAL TROPHY

This trophy is given to the team placing first in the Showjumping Team Club Challenge. The trophy was kindly donated by Swan Zone.

OFF THE TRACK

All thoroughbreds and standardbreds bred for racing that compete at the Championships qualify for the Off the Track Award. When entering you will be asked to include your Off the Track passport number and the racing name of your horse. Awarded to eligible horses that compete in Individual and Team classes on Friday and Saturday.
