CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES – PONY CLUB RIDER ENTRIES

1. Riders must be current, financial Junior or Senior Riding members of a Pony Club Affiliated with Pony Club WA.
2. Riders are to enter their entry details and payments via Event Secretary. [Event Secretary](#)
3. All clubs will be sent a list of riders entered after the close of entries with a Club Endorsement and Declaration spreadsheet.
4. Club Endorsement and Declaration spreadsheets are to be uploaded to [Jotform](#) .
5. Clubs will place you in a team after the close of entries.
6. Please include your Helper Duty, Yard Bookings and Declaration of Qualification with your entry.

NON-CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS – PONY CLUB RIDER ENTRIES

1. Riders must be current, financial Junior or Senior Riding members of a Pony Club Affiliated with Pony Club WA.
2. Riders are to enter the event and payments via Event Secretary. [Event Secretary](#)
3. All clubs will be sent a list of riders entered after the close of entries with a Club Endorsement and Declaration spreadsheet.
4. Club Endorsement and Declaration spreadsheets are to be uploaded to [Jotform](#) .
5. Clubs will place you in a team after the close of entries.
6. Please include Helper Duty, Yard Booking, and Declaration of Qualification with your entry. Rider Declaration of Qualification & Helper Duties will be made through Event Secretary.

NON-CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS – OPEN PONY CLUB RIDER ENTRIES

1. Riders must be current, financial members of Pony Club WA and aged 18 years and over. Eligible membership categories to compete at this Championship are: Adult Riding Member, Open Rider Member or Top Up Member. One Event membership is not able to be used for this event. Junior and Senior Pony Club members are not eligible to compete in this section.
2. Riders are to enter the event and payments via Event Secretary. [Event Secretary](#)
3. Please include Helper Duty, Yard Booking, and Declaration of Qualification with your entry. Rider declaration of qualification & Helper duties will be made through Event Secretary.

CLUB INFORMATION

All clubs will be sent a list of riders entered after the close of entries with a Club Endorsement and Declaration spreadsheet.

From the summary of entries, Clubs will need to:

- Verify that all club member rider/horse combinations entered in the Championship classes have completed 3 working rallies.
- Verify all riders entering the Championship classes are duly qualified as per 2024 criteria
- Put together club teams
- Select Team Managers
- Verify that all club member rider/horse combinations entered in the Non-Championship classes are competent at the level entered, have completed a minimum of 2 working rallies, and completed 1 event at the height they are entering.

TEAM MANAGERS

- The position of a Team Manager is classed as a part of a helper duty – they will be given a pack away duty as well. The Team Manager nominated may not be nominated for any other rider's helper duty.
- Team Managers will be expected to attend all Team Manager meetings/briefings.
- Team Managers are expected to remain with their Team for the duration of each phase – gear check, warm up, competition.

- Team Managers are responsible for making all Team Members feel valued and important.
- Team Managers are responsible for making composite riders feel like a team.
- Team Managers to whom parent exemption does not apply MUST have a current Working with Children Check.
- Team Managers are expected to be conversant with the Role of a Team Manager outlined in the Pony Club WA Handbook: [Information for Team Managers](#)

HELPER DUTIES

- A helper needs to be provided for each horse/rider combination. No Self-Help is available.
- Volunteer helpers over the age of 18 that will be having contact with children in the line of their duty and to whom parent exemption does not apply MUST have a current Working with Children Check.
- Helper Duties will be between 3-4 hours duration. If your helper duty only takes an hour ie SJ Pack Away – you will be given other duties to make up the time.
- If you have multiple riders, you may be given 1 longer duty instead of two 3-4 hour duties where possible.
- Your helper duty might clash with your child's riding time – we apologise in advance but your Team Manager will be there to help your child.
- If you can't make your Helper Duty – it is your Club's responsibility to fill in for you.
- If you don't complete your Helper Duty – your rider will be eliminated.
- If you scratch prior to the event after the draw has been posted, it is your Club's responsibility to complete your helper duty.

CAMPING & YARDS

Camping is available on the grounds for a fee per night of \$10 per family non-powered site. Book through Event Secretary entry.

Yards are available for a fee of \$10 per yard for the duration of the event. Book through Event Secretary.

EVENING MEALS & CANTEEN

A full canteen will be provided over the weekend by Serpentine Horse & Pony Club.

A Saturday night dinner can be ordered.

PONY CLUB WA – NO DOG POLICY

This is a Pony Club WA event, and the policy of **NO DOGS** will be strictly adhered to. Failure to abide by this policy may result in the elimination of rider(s).

Assistance animals approved by the Department of Local Government; Sport & Cultural Industries are exempt from this rule. Persons with an Assistance Animal may be requested to provide their approval documentation.

SWABBING

Pony Club WA adheres to a policy of random swabbing at our State competitions.

QUALIFYING FOR CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

1. The horse and rider combination must have attended 3 rallies as per the 2024 State Event Program.
2. Horse/Rider combinations must have achieved 2 qualifying results at the grade they wish to compete in the period from 8 October 2023 (*close of entries 2023 State Eventing Championships*) to 1 September 2024. Events being used for qualifying events (until 27 October 2024) after the close of entries will need to be sent directly to the Eventing Committee Secretary eventing@ponyclubwa.asn.au at the completion of the event.
3. If a horse/rider combination incurs more than 50 penalties in the Dressage, this score will not be accepted as a qualifying round.
4. If a horse/rider combination incurs more than 65 penalties in the Cross Country OR more than 16 penalties in the Jumping phase, this score will not be accepted as a qualifying round. This is a total of both Jumping and time penalties for each phase.
5. Qualifying events are to be done at two separate events at different locations with one being outside their own club.
6. Qualifying events can be from Pony Club or EWA events.
7. Pony Club events need to be signed off by the Technical Delegate for that event as complying with the specifications for cross country and jumping courses as described in Appendix III of Pony Club WA Eventing Rules.
8. Riding down – see rule 15.1
Rule 15.1 Riding Down Championships: A horse/rider combination shall NOT be allowed to ride down directly to a Championship. If a horse has been ridden down, it shall only be allowed to compete at a Championship if it has competed only at the lower level for the 12 calendar months prior to the Championships. If the grade that the horse/rider combination is qualified is not offered then, at the committee's discretion, a rider may ride down at Championships and carry the 7.5 penalties. A Horse Rider Combination is deemed to have qualified if they have achieved a qualifying score at least two or more events at the level in the 12 months preceding the close of entries.

QUALIFYING FOR NON-CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

- Horse/Rider combinations need to have completed one event at the requested height in the twelve months in the lead up to the event, have completed a minimum of 2 working rallies, and be signed off as competent at the level entered by Club Chief Coach.
- Open Riders do not have to complete 2 rallies but must have completed one event at the requested height in the twelve months in the lead up to the event

CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION

1. This event is to be run under the Current Pony Club WA Eventing Rules.
2. Eligible riders may compete on TWO different horses in two different grades, providing that both horses are duly qualified to compete. The SECOND nominated horse may NOT displace another rider who is entering their primary horse for that grade.
3. Each horse may only be ridden by one rider for the duration of the event.
4. Declaration of qualification and eligibility must be signed by the chief coach and an executive member of the rider's club will be required with all entry nominations for State Eventing Championships.
5. Riders' ages are from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the required age for the grade nominated. Required ages for each class are PC 110 - 14 years, PC 105 - 13 years, PC 95 - 12 years, PC 80 - 11 years, PC 65 - 10 years, PC 45 - 9 years.
6. For State Eventing Championships there must be at least two judges per dressage arena

for PC 110 & PC 105.

7. Teams of four or three Riders will be drawn for the competition. The best three (3) scores will be counted to make the team total. If entries are insufficient for a team competition in any grade, then teams of two or three will be drawn. In this case the best two (2) scores will be counted.
8. Clubs are not permitted to replace a horse/rider in a Club team with a horse/rider from a composite team after the draw has been published.
9. Plaiting is compulsory for the dressage phase of this event.

TEAM COMPOSITION

PC 65 / 80 CLUB TEAMS - for teams of three (3) or four (4) members and/or Associate members from the one club. If a club has more than 4 riders entered, the number of members per team shall always form the majority.

PC 95/105/110 CLUB TEAMS - for teams of three (3) or four (4) members and/or Associate members from the one club without restrictions on the number of associates competing. (If there are less than six (6) entries in any year teams of two (2) riders will be considered)

NOTE: A club is permitted to enter more than one (1) Club Team provided such Club has a minimum of seven (7) qualified horse and rider combinations.

COMPOSITE TEAMS - for teams of three (3) or four (4) individual competitors comprising:
Additional members and/or associate members from clubs with teams already entered in Club Teams maximum of two (2) members and/or Associate members from clubs NOT entered in Club Teams.
Additional members and/or associate members from clubs with teams already entered in Club Teams maximum of two (2) members and/or Associate members from clubs NOT entered in Club Teams.

In the case of equal penalties, the rider will be placed by XC optimum time.
