2026 Sports Leaderboards Terms & Conditions

Aims & Objectives

1. As a riding member of Pony Club WA, you do not need to register for the leaderboard – you are automatically included.
2. Riders undertake to have read, understood, and agree to the Terms and Conditions of the 2026 Sports Leaderboard series.
3. Riders are bound by Pony Club WA Rules, Policies and Codes of Conduct.
4. If found to be in breach of a code of conduct or on report for an offence at a competition, Riders may be withdrawn from the Pony Club WA Sports Leaderboards at the discretion of the Pony Club WA General Manager.
5. Riders acknowledge that Pony Club WA reserves the right to review this document including the grades, age groups, rules, regulations and Terms and Conditions contained within, at any time whilst the 2026 Leaderboards are running.

Are you eligible?

6. You must have current Pony Club WA riding membership. Age will be taken as at the 1 January 2026
7. 2026 Leaderboard will run from 1 November 2025 to 22 November 2026, and. For the year 2027, the season will run from 1 January 2027 to 12 November 2027. All approved leaderboard competitions will be run between these dates. This will ensure that new members are able to compete in all the Leaderboard events for that year.
8. All members who take part in a leaderboard event are automatically included in the leaderboard of that discipline and class.
9. Leadline classes are eligible for Hickstead Leaderboard events.

What is required of members?

10. All members must have their horse or pony registered on JustGo membership platform (under credentials). You must not change your horses' name on entry packs throughout the year, or they will be counted as separate horses.
11. OTT paperwork must have been completed to be eligible for this award. This includes OTT details of Racing Name and Passport Number. The registered name will be the horse's entry name.
12. A rider/horse combination can enter 2 separate disciplines on one day and receive points in both for the following leaderboards:
 - Dressage
 - Hickstead & Hunter Trials
 - Showjumping
 - Tetrathlon
13. It is the member's responsibility to review the updated leaderboard on a regular basis to ensure results submitted are correct.

14. It is the responsibility of the rider to check their results throughout the year to report any errors in a Jot form [Leaderboard Queries](#) this will ensure that results can be finalised in a timely manner.

Leaderboards will be closed to querying of event results in 3 rounds as follows:

- Round 1 - For events held between 1 November 2025 and 31 March 2026, any results discrepancies must be queried by 15 April and locked down 30 April.
- Round 2 - For events held 1 April to 31 July, queries in by 15 August and results locked down 31 August; and
- Round 3 - For events held 1 August to 22 November – queries in by 25 November and results locked down 27 November.

How are Results and Levies worked out?

15. Clubs must submit their results on the designated spreadsheet in the required format within 14 days of the event [2026 Leaderboard Event Results Spreadsheet.xlsx](#)
16. Pony Club WA will issue an invoice for the levies based on horse and rider combinations, and payment must be paid within 14 days of receipt.
17. Upon receipt, results will be posted to Pony Club WA Website.
18. Levies payable is \$3.00 per horse and rider combination per round, or per test. See Table B.
19. Results from both Hickstead and Hunter Trials events will be entered on one combined Hickstead/Hunter Trials Leaderboard.
20. Results from the Active Riding leaderboard will be a combined leaderboard including placings for novelties, Pony Club Mount/Active Riding Challenge, as well as PPMG. As a team event, the final place for the PPMG team will be reflected against the individual competitors in that team.
21. The Final 2026 Provisional results will be published 25 November 2026. Riders will be given 48 hours to query the final provisional results leaderboard before final placings are published on the 27 November 2026. No queries will be taken after this date.
22. If a situation eventuates that is not covered under the Terms and Conditions of the Sports Leaderboard, the Pony Club WA Sports Leaderboard Coordinator will allocate points in the spirit of fairness and consistency.

How does Scoring work?

23. If more than one test or class, per level or height, per day is scheduled at an event, placings will be awarded to:
 - The highest place per day per level per discipline
 - The only exception to this is the Active Riding Leaderboard where each class can receive 1 placing per day (Classes refer to: PPMG Final Score, Per Novelty, Pony Club Mount/Active Riding Challenge).
24. Where a rider is riding two rounds at the same grade at the one event, the highest placing will be awarded.
25. If the age category of a class does not equate to the Sports Leaderboard age categories, riders will be awarded points for the actual place achieved in the class according to their age category on the leaderboard. This will only occur if the classes do not correspond to the leaderboard and there is no suitable age class available.
26. Riders who enter a class they are not eligible for will not receive points for placing in that class, unless point 25 applies.
27. Points earned in a lower grade cannot be carried over to a higher grade.
28. A horse/rider combination can be awarded points and place in two grades over the year but not in the same event on any particular day.
29. Where there are equal points being placed, awards will be allocated to each rider.
30. If a rider is competing more than one day at an Event, points will apply each day per horse rider combination per discipline per level. Levies will be charged each day. These classes will be noticed as a leaderboard event on the program for riders to choose.

Disciplinary Action

31. If a member is suspended by Pony Club WA for any matter other than medical suspension, they will forfeit their right to participate in the Sports Leaderboard Series.
Disciplinary Action

Points Allocation and Championship Points

32. Points and Championship Points will be awarded after each event. Championship events will attract double points per place. 1st = 14pts, 2nd = 12pts, 3rd = 10pts, 4th = 8pts, 5th = 6pts, 6th = 4pts, and 2 points for completing the event as per Table C
33. Points are awarded on the following:
1st = 7pts, 2nd = 6pts, 3rd = 5pts, 4th = 4pts, 5th = 3pts, 6th = 2pts, and 1 point for completing the event as per Table C

What are the Clubs' obligations?

34. Event date applications must be forwarded to the Pony Club WA Office when requested, noting that the 2027 season will be run from January 2027 to 12 November 2027. Please note that all officials at Leaderboard events must be Current Members of PCWA on Justgo.
35. Clubs that register their event as a Sports Leaderboard Event do so, acknowledging that they have read, understood and agree to the terms and conditions of the 2026 Sports Leaderboard Information Pack
36. Club entry pack and advertising material must include this event is part of the “Pony Club WA Sports Leaderboards”.
37. Clubs may be limited to 3 Leaderboard events per discipline per club. This will be at the discretion of Pony Club WA and should be discussed with General Manager prior to submissions.
38. Events not registered as Sports Leaderboard events with Pony Club WA will not be included on the Sports Leaderboard.
39. Each event must run in accordance with all current Pony Club WA Rules.
40. Clubs should run classes as per the Sports Leaderboard classifications.
41. Where clubs are running more than one class per leaderboard discipline/level per day, only one set of points per leaderboard level will count per rider. This could mean that two riders receive the same number of points for a leaderboard level at an event even though they competed in or placed in different classes. Eg if they are running two 60cm classes, both first place getters receive the same number of points.
42. Clubs should advertise classes as Sports Leaderboard eligible, so that riders know which classes to enter to be allocated points to the leaderboard.
43. Age is at 1 January of the current year.
44. All events must have Pony Club WA or EA Accredited Officials with an officials membership on Justgo.
45. The event must be open to all Pony Club WA Riding Members.
46. Clubs must pay a minimum of \$3.00 Leaderboard levy per Pony Club WA Junior, Senior and Open Rider per round/test. See **Table B** for more information of extra charges that may be payable.
47. Clubs to forward full results in the required format to the Pony Club WA Office within 14 days of the event being held. Events held after 14 November results must be submitted 48 hours (9am Tuesday) after the event or the results will not be added to the leaderboard and no refunds will be given, this is because we are moving the 2027 leaderboard to suit the calendar year. 48. Clubs to pay levies on receipt of invoice from Pony Club WA within 14 days to pay.

Upgrading and Downgrading

49. Points for a horse and rider combination will not be converted to a higher or lower level should a rider change throughout the year. The points stay with the horse and rider combination at that level. Your points tally will start from zero on the new level. No upgrading or downgrading points will apply.
50. Members may downgrade at any time, or multiple times throughout the sports leaderboard season.

How can my Off the Track horse be recognised in Leaderboards?

51. Any registered thoroughbred or standardbred is eligible to register for the Off the Track Sports Leaderboard.
52. Sponsored by Off the Track WA, this leaderboard collates all points earned in all of the leaderboards, except Active Riding.
53. Riders must register their mount using JustGo (in Credentials) and must supply a passport number and/or race name for verification. It is essential that you provide the details of your passport when entering events for them to be counted on this leaderboard. Make the racing name correct and unchanged so that the points are allocated to the correct horse and not missed.
54. Off the Track points are automatically counted as they are added to the relevant Sports Leaderboard.
55. All other rules and regulations refer to the standard Sports Leaderboard rules and regulations.
56. The Off the Track horse that gains the most points in any of the leaderboards will receive a rug and Rosette for first place.
57. Rosettes will be awarded to the second and third highest placegetter in each discipline.
58. An OTT horse is able to win an award in more than one Sports Leaderboard.

What happens at the end of the Leaderboard season?

59. Awards for the 2026 Sports Leaderboard will be presented at the 2026 Pony Club WA Awards Event held on the 12 December 2026 at the State Equestrian Centre.
60. Rugs will be presented to winners of each class for all leaderboards.
61. Rosettes 1st to 6th for all disciplines.
62. Vouchers to all Sports Leaderboards place getters 1st to 6th. (subject to sponsorship)
63. “Bustin Thru” Strongest Eventing Club Trophy is awarded to the club with the highest percentage of rider horse combinations with points in the Eventing Sports Leaderboard. The combination of horse and rider total Eventing points for the year will be totalled for all that clubs riders, then those totals will be divided by the total number of clubs Eventing, and the highest percentage will be the winner for 2026.
