HELPER DUTIES

- You will be able to nominate your helper duty preferences on JustGo during the entry process.
- Nominated helpers are asked to complete two helper duties, one on Saturday and one on Sunday. This will ensure that all helper duties are short, and parents are able to support their own child during the riding phase.
- Working With Children Card parent exemption only applies if your child is competing at this event.
- Each competitor must provide a helper (16 years and over) capable of performing any rostered duty.
- One helper cannot be the designated helper for more than two competitors.
- Helper duty preferences are to be nominated with the rider's entry; allocation of helper duties will be completed by the organising committee.
- Helper duty allocations will be published as soon as possible after the draw is complete.
- For insurance, child safeguarding and administration reasons, all helpers must be a member of a WA Pony Club or Pony Club Direct (Supporter Membership is free).

RALLY QUALIFICATION CRITERIA (Championship classes only)

- Riders who have achieved their C*/K Proficiency Certificate are only required to complete two qualifying rallies.
- All other riders must attend a minimum of three hours at three separate Working Rallies prior to 15 March 2026, two of which must be at the club at which they are a member;
- Participate in at least one ridden session at each Working Rally;
If riding two horses at a Working Rally, riders must participate in at least one ridden session on each horse; and
- A maximum of two horses/ponies may be ridden by one rider at any Working Rally

EVENT QUALIFICATION CRITERIA (Championship classes only)

- Riders entering classes 1 or 2 must have completed without elimination or retirement one Show Jumping competition round at 45cm or higher on the mount they are entered on.
- Riders entering classes 3 to 10 must have completed without elimination or retirement one Tetrathlon, Cross Country, Hickstead or Hunter Trials competition round on the mount and at the same height or higher than they are entered.

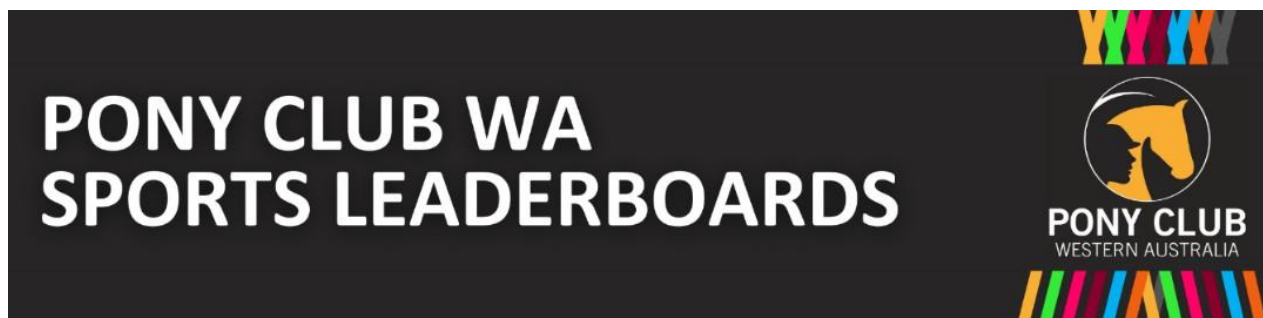
GOLDEN TICKETS

BRIDLE NUMBERS

All horses must display a bridle number, clearly visible on each side of the horse (bridle or saddle cloth). Bridle numbers will be allocated by the Organising Committee, and this number will be shown on the draw.

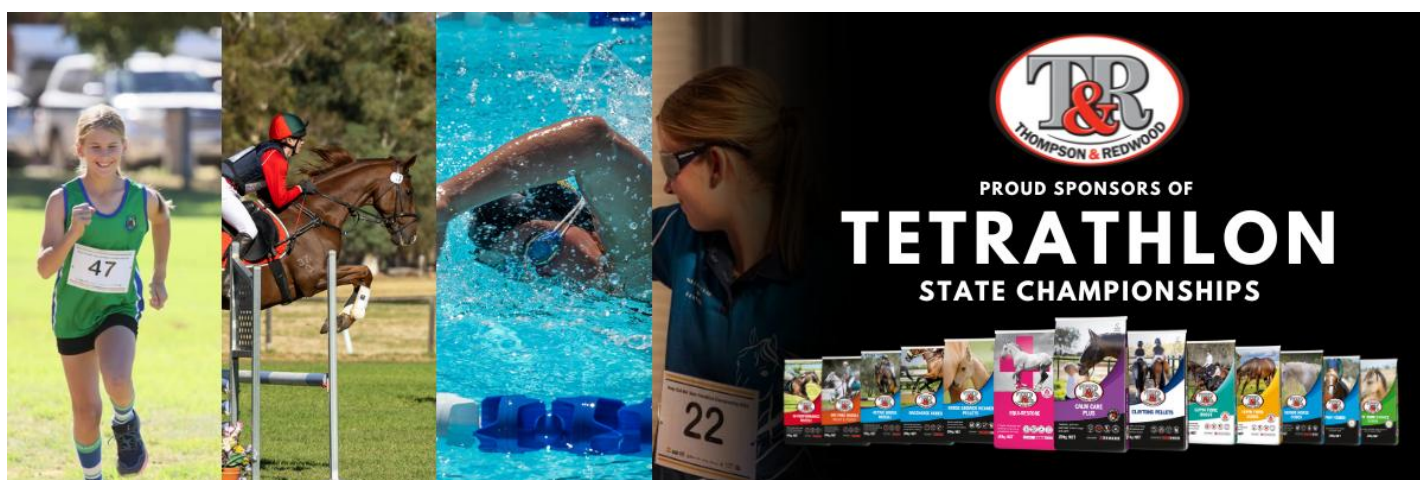
CLASSES

2026 NON CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

The WA State Championship will offer Non Championship classes at each jumping height. There are no qualification requirements to enter Non Championship classes. Riders will need to submit a signed competency declaration for the jumping height they have entered.

2026 OPEN RIDER CLASSES

The WA State Championship will offer Open Rider classes at each jumping height. There are no qualification requirements to enter Open Rider classes.

2026 TEAM CLASSES

The WA State Championship will have a team competition at each jumping height. Riders must be competing in a Championship class and can be in any age class at that jumping height. Clubs are encouraged to make teams if possible. Riders without a club team will be allocated to a composite team.

AWARDS

- Rosettes to 6th place for individual championship, non-championship and open riders, saddle blankets for individual winners.
- Rosettes to 3rd place for team placings, rugs for the winning teams.
- Sharpshooter Trophy for the team with the highest combined shoot score.
- Lucy Oorschot Trophy – for the female athlete with the highest combined run and swim score in the 80cm and 95cm Championship Classes.

Riders in Championship and Non-Championship Classes are eligible for the following awards:

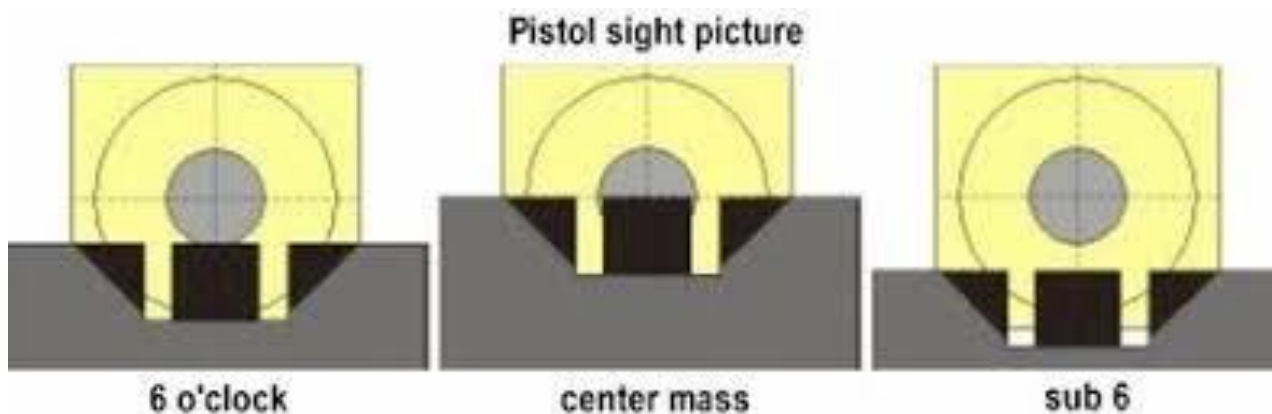
- Highest scoring shooter (7m, 10m).
- Highest scoring swimmer (2 minutes, 4 minutes).
- Highest scoring runner (1000m, 2000m).
- Highest scoring rider (45cm SJ, 45cm XC, 65cm, 80cm, 95cm). If more than one rider scores 1400 then the winner will be the rider with the fastest gate time.
- All thoroughbreds and standardbreds bred for the purpose of racing that compete in the event qualify for the Off the Track Awards. When entering you will be asked to provide the Off the Track passport number and racing name for your horse.



SHOOTING

The pool pistols provided for the competition will be calibrated to the sub 6 o'clock position. This means that the pistols are set to hit above the point of aim (e.g., if you aim below the bullseye, you should hit the bullseye. This is done as it is easier to accurately line up the sights when you have a white background.)

Competitors are allowed to use their own laser pistol. Pistols will be inspected prior to use and must be a UIPM endorsed laser pistol and have no modifications to the standard issue barrel or trigger.



CLUB COORDINATOR

Each Club must nominate a Club Coordinator.

- A Zoom briefing meeting will be held in the week prior to the event for all Club Coordinators.
- The purpose of the zoom meeting is to distribute information and provide a forum for queries and clarifications.
- Club Coordinators must supply a mobile phone number which they can be always contacted on during the event.
- The Club Coordinator has replaced the Team Manager role.
- Individuals will collect their own bib numbers.

YARDS

A very limited number of enclosed yards are available; these can be booked by competitors camping at the grounds by emailing donna.black@me.com. Priority will be given to riders travelling greater distances to the event. Tie up pens are available and free for single day use.

CAMPING & SHOWERS

Please indicate on your Online Entry if you will be camping for the weekend, there is no charge, and the information will greatly assist the committee in planning to accommodate the required number of campers. One male and one female hot shower is available at the grounds. Please shower before arriving, or at the pool on Saturday if possible.

MEALS

Wallangarra Horse & Pony Club will be running a canteen on Saturday and Sunday to provide a range of food. A two-course meal is available to pre-order for dinner on Saturday night for **\$15 per person**.

TEAMS

- Teams can be of four or three riders.
- Teams can be made up of Championship riders of any age who are jumping the same height. Clubs may nominate a team or teams in any jump height where they have sufficient competitors. Please provide the name of the team on the Club Rally Endorsement Spreadsheet.
- If a club does not have enough riders for a team, where possible composite teams will be created.

HORSES

The one horse, one rider rule will apply for all classes.

RIDERS

Riders may only compete in one class.

Riders must be a current financial Junior or Senior Riding Members with Pony Club WA.

Rider age is calculated as the age on 01 January 2026.

Open Riders are riders 18 years or over as of 01 January 2026 and are current financial members with Pony Club WA in one of the following categories: Adult Member, Top-Up Member, Open Rider Member

SWABBING

Pony Club WA adheres to a policy of random swabbing at our state competitions.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

A **WWC Check** is required by a person if they engage in certain paid or unpaid work with children, described as 'child-related work' under the WWC Act.

Volunteers engaged in helper duties at Pony Club WA State Championships where the **usual duties** involve, or are they are likely to involve contact with a child such as Club Coordinator, Gear Checking, and Marshalling, will be required to have a current WWCC unless a Parent Exemption applies.

A Parent Exemption applies if you are volunteering and have a child under the age of 18 competing in the event you are volunteering at.

QUALIFICATION

There will be random checks of Qualification with your clubs.

PONY CLUB WA – NO DOG POLICY

This is a Pony Club WA event, and the policy of NO DOGS will be strictly adhered to. Failure to abide by this policy may result in the elimination of rider(s).

Assistance animals approved by the DCITS are exempt from this rule. Persons with an Assistance Animal may be requested to provide their approval documentation.

If you have family members or friends attending, please remind them of the No Dog Policy.

ELECTRIC BIKES & E SCOOTERS

Electric Bikes and E Scooters are not permitted at this event.

PRESENTATIONS

Presentations will take place at the conclusion of all phases. Rosettes and Prizes not collected will be available to be collected from the Pony Club WA office.

GEAR CHECKING

All saddlery must comply with the current Pony Club Australia Gear Rules.

Riders under the age of 18 years must present to the Gear Checker with a parent or guardian.

If a rider has a Gear Exemption, it must be presented to the Gear Checker at each class entered.
