HELPER DUTIES

- All helpers must be a minimum of 16 years of age and capable of performing the duty selected.
- Helper Duties will be via Sign Up, and will be open on 2 May 2026 and close on 9 May 2026.
- Team Managers are expected to do a helper duty.
- Each rider is required to supply one helper per day of competition. So if you're riding on both Saturday and Sunday, you'll need to do a helper duty on both days. Families with more than one rider must provide a helper for each rider.
- IF A RIDER SCRATCHES AFTER THE CLOSE OF ENTRIES, THEY ARE STILL RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING A HELPER ON THE DAY OR COORDINATING WITH THEIR CLUB TO COVER THE ROSTERED DUTY.
- All helpers must be a member of a Pony Club WA (Support Membership is free), please supply their name, and contact number on SignUp, you will be required to upload a photo of their Working With Children card.

RALLY QUALIFICATION CRITERIA (EXCLUDES OPEN RIDERS)

- Riders who have achieved their C*/K Proficiency Certificate are only required to complete two qualifying rallies.
- All other riders need three rallies as a qualifier to attend this event. They must attend a minimum of three hours at three separate Working Rallies prior to 19 April 2026, two of which must be at the club they are a member
- Participate in at least one ridden session at each Working Rally;
If riding two horses at a Working Rally, riders must participate in at least one ridden session on each horse; and
- A maximum of two horses/ponies may be ridden by one rider at any Working Rally

EVENT QUALIFICATION CRITERIA (INCLUDES OPEN RIDERS)

Each horse and rider must keep a [Showjumping Performance Diary](#), signed by an accredited Pony Club or EWA Showjumping Judge or Course Designer. This record should demonstrate that they have completed at least two rounds at the competing height or higher (45cm rounds will be accepted for 50cm classes), with no more than 16 penalties, at an official Pony Club or EWA event. Training rounds, eventing or tetrathlon from official events are now also accepted.

The rider is responsible for maintaining this information and providing it to the Club as proof of their qualification

There will be random checks of Qualification with your clubs.

BRIDLE NUMBERS

All horses must display a bridle number, clearly visible on each side of the horse (bridle or saddle cloth). Bridle numbers will be allocated by the Organising Committee, and this number will be shown on the draw.

HOW TO ENTER

RIDERS

- Please set-up a rider profile and ensure your horse is registered on Just Go
- Ensure you are logged in to JustGo using the competitor's membership number
- Please make sure you select the correct SEC Facility Fee (\$15 per horse per day), and the correct First Aid Levy (\$20 per rider per day)
- Apart from Combined Training, consecutive heights are permitted. All entries are subject to endorsement by the Club Declaration after confirming the Showjumping Performance Record.
- Entries will close at 11.59pm on 19 April 2026. **No late entries will be accepted.**
- Riders must be a current financial Riding Member with Pony Club WA.
- Rider age is calculated as the age on 01 January 2026.
- You are allowed to do 3 jumping starts per day

HORSES

- The one horse, one rider rule will apply for all classes.
- There is no longer a maximum number of horses a member may ride at the championships, as long as they are rally qualified.
- Plaiting is not mandatory but is encouraged for the Combined Training, Club Team & Championship Classes.

CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS

238.2.2 One Round with a Jump Off

This is a Competition against the clock, but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place, there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties and time in the first round.

TEAM EVENTS

- Club Teams- Teams may have 3 or 4 riders. Only riders who have been notified by their Club of their selection can enter the Club Teams class. Nominations must be submitted on this JotForm: [Club Team Nomination Form](#) by Sunday 19 April. **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
- Zone Teams – Teams must have 4 riders. The Championship classes on Sunday are open to individual riders. Prior to the event, zones will select (using either run-offs or prior results) one competitor from the 60cm class, one competitor from the 80cm class and one competitor from the 100cm class to make up a team of 3. Nominations to be submitted on this Jot Form: [Zone Team Nomination Form](#) by Sunday 19 April. No late entries will be accepted. Results from the individual championship class will be converted to zone scores as follows:
1st Place = 40 points
2nd Place = 39 points
3rd Place = 38 points
4th Place = 37 points
And so on down to 40th place (or less if there are under 40 competitors in the class).


The two highest point-scoring riders will count toward the team total.

If two or more teams finish on the same total points, the times from the first round of the two counting riders will be added together, and the team with the shortest combined time will be placed higher.

FANCY DRESS

- All combinations must complete a Gear Check and comply with the PCA National Gear Rules.
- Rider outfit must include approved helmet and boots. Shoulders must be covered.
- Rider costume must be securely attached to the rider but not the horse; it must allow the rider to fall freely from the horse if needed.
- Horse costume must include a bridle and bit and be securely attached to the horse and/or saddlery. It should allow the rider to fall freely from horse if needed. The costume must have careful use of fastenings (e.g. Velcro, pins, elastic, string) and must not cause discomfort or restrict the horse's movement.
- Bell boots or exercise boots may not have decorations attached to them,
- Nothing in the fancy dress may present a tripping or tangling risk for the horse.
- Artificial colouring/spray painting of horses with non-toxic ingredients is permitted.

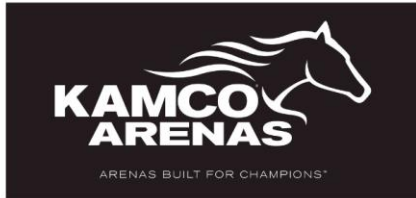

All saddlery must comply with the current Pony Club Australia Gear Rules.

Riders under the age of 18 years must present to the Gear Checker with a parent or guardian.

If a rider has a Gear Exemption, it must be presented to the Gear Checker at each class entered.

GOLDEN TICKETS

In line with our policy of sustainability, we will not be offering rider bags this year. Instead, Golden Tickets and prizes will be handed out and using drawn using your bridle number.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

A **WWC Check** is required by a person if they engage in certain paid or unpaid work with children, described as 'child-related work' under the WWC Act.

Volunteers engaged in helper duties at Pony Club WA State Championships where the **usual duties** involve, or are they are likely to involve contact with a child such as Club Coordinator, Gear Checking, and Marshalling, will be required to have a current WWCC unless a Parent Exemption applies.

A Parent Exemption applies if you are volunteering and have a child under the age of 18 competing in the event you are volunteering at, and are a current Supporter Member (no charge for this membership category).

ELECTRIC BIKES & E SCOOTERS

Electric Bikes and E Scooters are not permitted at this event.
